



A Light On Treacherous Waters

This is the story of the historic Hunting Island Light Station — the lighthouse itself and the people who made it operate. Hurricanes, turbulent times, erosion, depression and war — the lighthouse has endured them all and stands tall today.

It is the only historic lighthouse in South Carolina open to the public. Built for the first time in 1859 and destroyed two years later by Confederate troops, the lighthouse was rebuilt after the Civil War. Its tale is intertwined with that of the South Carolina coast— captivating hundreds of thousands of the people who visit this living legend every year.
